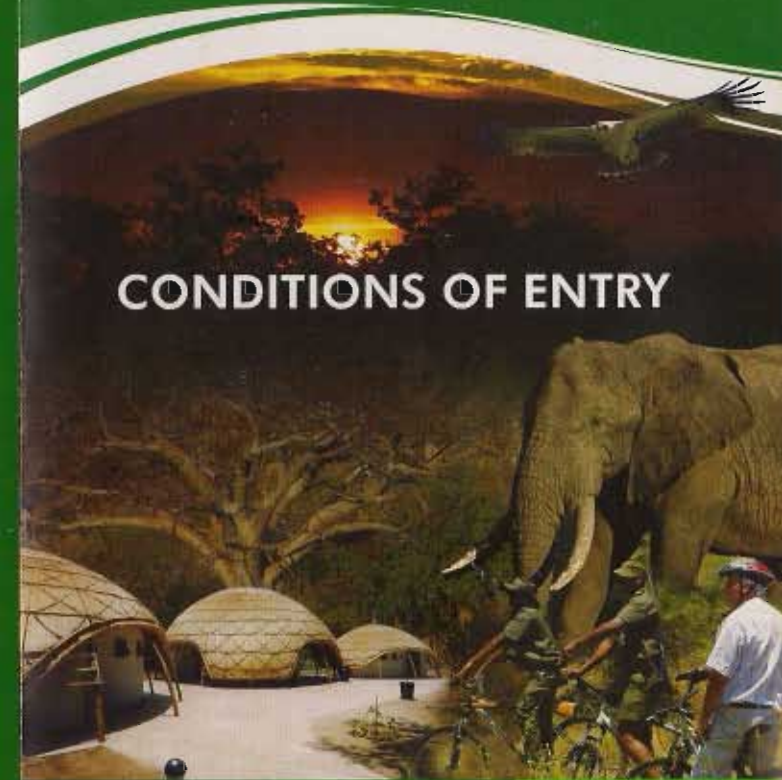

## KRUGER NATIONAL PARK WELCOMES YOU



### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

### YOUR NATURAL HERITAGE

You are entering the Kruger National Park at your own risk.  
THIS TRAVEL DOCUMENT IS IMPORTANT.  
PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY.

You will need it together with your permit during your stay:  
At the reception when you book accommodation, at the gate  
when you leave the National Park and on request of a park official.

## CODE OF "GOOD GAME VIEWING" PRACTICE

**CROSSING SINGLE LANE BRIDGES**

- When crossing single lane bridges or crossing points, vehicles may not come to a standstill for too long in cases where there is a vehicle trying to cross the point from either direction.

**GAME SIGHTING – CONGESTIONS**

- In case that there is a sighting with many cars causing congestions, the lane opposite (furthest away) the side of the game or object/s being viewed may not be blocked by stationary vehicles. This lane must be kept open for those that wish to pass the sighting. Please do not park diagonally, especially in the driving lanes.

**GAME SIGHTING – GENERAL**

- For game viewing, please park on the side of the road from which the game is located on as this will prevent cars from passing between the viewing vehicle and the object you are watching. Be careful when passing animals or birds close to the road – they could be alarmed by your approach and run onto the road.

If you must walk around at night please **DO NOT DO SO WITHOUT SHOES ON AND A TORCH**.

Remember by feeding any wildlife you are **SIGNING THEIR DEATH WARRANT, AS THEY MIGHT BECOME AGGRESSIVE** towards humans, resulting in them to be put down.

Please ensure that your stay is happy and safe by taking note of a few simple rules. You will be sharing your stay with many exciting and unusual creatures. **PLEASE TREAT THEM WITH CAUTION AND RESPECT.** Consult with the camp you are staying in for guidance.

TRANSGRESSION OF THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS CAN RESULT IN LEGAL ACTION BEING TAKEN AGAINST THE CULPRIT(S).



## GENERAL RULES

- STAY IN YOUR VEHICLE** - Unless in a designated area, visitors must remain inside their vehicle. No part of your body may protrude from a window or sunroof and doors should remain closed at all times.
- THE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT** - is 50 km/h on tar roads and 40 km/h on gravel roads. Speed checks are done throughout the Park. All speeding culprits will be heavily fined.
- DON'T DRINK & DRIVE** - General rules of the road apply within the KNP. It is an offence to drive on South African roads under the influence of alcohol.
- VALID LICENCE** - It is an offence to drive on South African roads without a recognised driver's licence.



**ROAD CLOSURE** - Please note that not all roads are accessible to caravans and, in case of high rainfall, certain tourist roads might be closed.



**ENTRANCE GATES** - Gate times must be strictly adhered to. Guests should be inside their allocated overnight camp by gate closing times. Day visitors should exit the Park before Entrance Gate closing time. Entrance gates can refuse entry to guests that arrive too late. Legal action will be taken against those not complying.



**OVERNIGHT VISITORS** - Are only allowed to stay at a booked and recognised overnight facility and must report to the reception before occupying accommodation or camping.



**DEPARTURE TIMES** - All accommodation and camping sites may be occupied from 14h00 on the day of arrival and must be vacated by 10h00 on the day of departure. Requests for late departure, in special cases only, may be made to the Duty Manager.



**DRIVING AREAS RESTRICTED** - Vehicles must remain on the designated roads at all times. Driving on closed or no-entry roads or off the paved surface is a serious offence.



**FEEDING OF GAME** - The feeding or disturbing of animals is a serious offence.



**REMOVING FLORA/FAUNA IS PROHIBITED** - No plant or animal or part thereof may be removed from the Park without permission.



**LARGE VEHICLE RESTRICTION** - Vehicles with a carrying capacity exceeding 4 000 kg, buses or any vehicles with more than 25 seats, are restricted to the tar roads only.



**BEWARE MALARIA ZONE** - The KNP is a malaria zone - we advise that all visitors adhere to a medical doctor's instructions.



**PET-FREE ZONE** - No animals of any kind may be brought into KNP.



**DISTURBING GAME IS PROHIBITED** - Touching, disturbing or harming of any animal is not permitted.



**A LITTER-FREE ZONE** - Littering is prohibited, as it can be dangerous for the animals.



**DECLARE WEAPONS AT GATE** - Please declare and seal all firearms / weapons of any sort at the entrance gate.



**NO KILLING OF ANIMALS** - Poaching and killing of animals is strictly prohibited and severely punishable by law.



**CHILDREN ON GAME DRIVES** - Children under 12 are not permitted to take part in organised game drives unless in designated areas.



**FIRE-FREE ZONE** - Fires may not be started, unless stated otherwise.



**SMOKING-FREE ZONE** - Smoking is not allowed in facilities indicated as such.



**STAY ON MARKED TRAILS** - Under no circumstances are guests allowed to stray off marked pathways.

## ELEPHANTS GENERAL RULES FOR SAFE VIEWING

- The potential dangers of breeding herds: Be careful when approaching elephant breeding herds with small calves. The matriarch or members from the herd can become aggressive, especially when small calves feel threatened by your nearby presence. Keep a safe distance and stay in your car.
- How to identify, approach and behave near musth bulls: Musth bulls are identified by the constant passing of small amounts of very strong smelling urine on the ground and hind legs. When walking on the road, they leave a characteristic trail of urine. Their temporal glands will also exude a dark liquid which is visible between the ear holes and eyes. Musth bulls can be quite aggressive and it is advisable to keep a safe distance at all times.
- Strict regulations on how to behave near wild elephants:
  - Do not drive off the road
  - Do not follow the elephants
  - Respect the elephants at all times
  - Always allow the elephants the right of way
  - Drive off slowly if they get too near
  - Do not cut off their path, especially when more than one vehicle is present
  - Do not rev the engine near elephants

As part of our mandate to protect our patrons, we conduct random movement control and vehicle searches of vehicles within the boundaries of the Kruger National Park

## STRICTLY PROHIBITED

- Traveling between rest camp and entrance gates after closing time is strictly prohibited.
- A stringent noise restriction is enforced between 21:30 and 06:00.
- Visitors should be aware that loud car stereo systems cause a disturbance to animals and other guests and volume levels should be kept to a minimum.
- The use of cell phones is permitted only in large rest camps and entrance gates.
- The use of roller skates, skateboards, bicycles, motorbikes and quadbikes is prohibited anywhere in the park.
